1. ADAM, Adolphe. 3pp ALS in French, nd, of the composer of *Giselle*. A friendly letter arranging a meeting.....\$50.00
2. ALBANI, Emma. Fine SPC, 1905.....\$85.00
3. AMATO, Pasquale. Inscribed 6x8 Mishkin SP, 1914.....\$100.00
4. ARTÔT, Desirée. 3pp ALS, April 16, 1858, in French the year of her Paris Opéra debut. She is singing *La Favorite* for the first time: "*Leonora commends herself to your benevolence and begs the same indulgence you had for Fidès.*" Rare of the great soprano, once betrothed to Tchaikovsky.....\$120.00
5. BALFE, M. W. 1P ANS "*Put on the title page composed and dedicated to Miss Emily Moylan by MW. Balfe.*" Mounting traces, small holes in the page center. Balfe, whose biography reads like the most extravagant Romantic novel, is scarce.....\$200.00
6. BARTOK, Béla. Autograph postcard (unsigned) to Adila Arányi with a short Christmas greeting inscribed on the picture of a rustic snow-covered barn, December 24, 1902. Bartok has struck out the German word "Postkarte" and replaced it with the equivalent "*Levelező-Lap.*" Bartok wrote two violin pieces, the Andante and the Duo, for Arányi in 1902.....\$1350.00

14. CALLAS, Maria. 9x12 double-weight Piccagliani photograph as Rosina. A fine print made about 20 years ago from the original negative. Not signed. Stamped by the photographer....\$250.00

15. CALVÉ, Emma. Fabulous 7x9 Dupont photo as La Marseillaise, boldly inscribed and dated 1916. Chipped on the edge and lightly creased, but this is nonetheless magnificent.....\$350.00

16. 14. CAMPORESE, Violante. Historic, rare 3pp ALS in Italian by the soprano (1785-1839) who first sang Donna Anna in London. "*Lord Darnley...invited me to sing at the Ancient Music Concert and to suggest a piece or two as long as they weren't by our recent masters like Rossini...There is a duet by Nasolini...which might do nicely for Malibran [sic] and myself since it was originally written for two sopranos...the trio from [Cimarosa's] Gli Orazi...would be suitable for Malibran, Donzelli and myself...*" The first we have seen of her.....\$350.00

17. CARTAGENOVA, Orazio. Important 3pp ALS in Italian, Vicenza 1841, to Felice Romani by the singer who, with Ronconi, is considered the first authentic opera baritone, creator of roles in operas by Bellini, Mercadante, Pacini. "*I have been busy learning a work...I had the good luck to give real pleasure and to live up to my*

reputation and to the expectations for the public – not small...every performance is a new triumph for me...in the difficult career of opera”.....\$200.00

18. CARUSO, Enrico. Spectacular large brush and ink self caricature as Rodolfo, signed with initials on grey drawing paper. Measures 9x12, dated on the verso 1911. This unpublished drawing has a light, almost imperceptible, stain and a few marginal tears which have been skillfully repaired. One of the finest we've seen by the tenor, it is a desirable prize for the Caruso collector.....\$2500.00

19. CARUSO, Enrico. Colorful postcard addressed in pencil to himself "Caruso, Continental, Ostende". Minor wear.....\$350.00

20. CARVALHO, Caroline. 2pp ANS in French with carte de visite photo of the first Marguerite and Juliette.....\$100.00

CRIVELLI, Gaetano. 2pp ALS in Italian to Benelli, Milan 1819, by the great Italian tenor (1768-1836), the first London Don Ottavio and creator of Meyerbeer's *Il Crociato in Egitto*, discussing the "Scala enterprise, of which rumors are being heard" and declaring that although Barbaja wants him, "I tell you in confidence that I do not like going to Naples..." Of extreme rarity.....\$200.00

24. CRUVELLI, Sofia. Rare 1p ALS in French to Benjamin Lumley, nd, by the soprano noted for her Verdi performances, creator of *Hélène in Les Vêpres Siciliennes*, discussing dates for performances in London. Slight tear.....\$200.00

25. DAMOREAU-CINTI, Laure. Fine small 2pp ALS in French by the great coloratura soprano, creator of many Rossini operas..\$85.00

26. DAWSON, Peter. Album page inscribed "To my good cohort Fred Gaisberg, In sincere friendship covering forty-five years 1904-49 an unbroken record...".....\$200.00

27. DEL MONACO, Mario. Fine 4x6 SP of the great tenor.....\$200.00

28. DE LUCIA, Fernando. Extremely rare 3pp ALS in Italian, London, 1900, to "Maestro" (probably Tosti), "I am sending you a score of *Tosca*, as a present on your name day...My wife is sending you a coffee machine, brought all the way from Naples..." One of the rarest and most sought after opera names.....\$450.00

29. DE LUCIA, Fernando. Superb printed visiting card, with a brief handwritten greeting.....\$250.00

30. DE RESZKE, Jean and Edouard. Engraved letter, dated 1896, hand signed by both at the bottom: "We are deeply touched by the unique and unprecedented favour shown to us by the musical Press of London and beg to tender you the expression of our sincerest thanks and heartfelt gratitude." Includes a matching pair of London Stereoscopic cabinet photos.....\$385.00

31. DESTINN, Emmy. Spectacular 7½ x 11 signed half-tone photo (from Theater Magazine) as Pamina signed "Emmy Destinn as Pamina in the Magic Flute, London, 1928." Slight creases and chipping on the edges. Unusual!.....\$250.00

32. EDISON, Thomas. Important 2p ALS in pencil, signed "E" but with his name in the text, September 5, 1922. "I have two records, both same tunes on Victor & Edison. One is a Banjo, one a song both by Elizabeth Spencer. These with 2 or 3 good Edison Records could be used by your Canvassers...." Edison presumably wants to show the superior sound of his own records. He was consumed with jealousy over the commercial success of the Victor Company.....\$2500.00

33. ELGAR, Edward. 2pp ALS to Dr. East, Malvern, January 1, 1903, wishing him a happy new year. "Come and see me soon...the work goes on merrily. Yesterday I went for a walk...I had some fizz for dinner...and am feeling nearly well..." The perfect Elgar letter for a Doctor!.....\$750.00

34. FAGOAGA, Isidoro. 4x6 SP in *Götterdämmerung*.....\$85.00

35. GENCER, Leyla. Rare inscribed 4x7 SP as Tosca, 1955..\$250.00

36. GIGLI, Beniamino. Superb inscribed 7x9 SP, 1935.....\$250.00

37. GIUGLINI, Antonio. Rare letter in Italian, 1863, by the tenor who died tragically young (1827-65), describing his St. Petersburg debut in *La Favorita*: "Hardly had I uttered a few phrases of the first Romanza than I was interrupted by very long applause...the second opera that I do will be *La Sonnambula*..."..\$150.00

38. GODOWSKY, Leopold. ALS on both sides of a fabulous postcard of old Prague dated 1935. He describes the cure he will undertake.

39. GRASSINI, Josephina. 4pp ALS, a long letter in Italian, Florence 1823, complaining of the Duke of Camerino "*He of all people should know about correct behavior...*" Grassini (1773-1850) was a legendary contralto. Her niece was Giulia Grisi.....\$200.00

GRAZIANI, Lodovico. 2pp ALS in Italian, 1850, thanking the agent Torri for his offer of a job in Barcelona, but he is engaged in Trieste and besides he would have only accepted the Barcelona offer as "*Absolute First Tenor*" and in an opera seria of his choice. Extremely rare of the tenor (1820-1885) who created Alfredo in the world premier of *La Traviata* in 1853.....\$350.00
41. GRIEG, Edvard. Superb SPc of the composer.....\$2000.00
42. GRISI, Giulia. Fine 1p ALS in English, 1854. "*Thank you for your very kind attention to my little girls.*" With a superb portrait lithograph of the beautiful soprano, one of the greatest names in opera history, the first Adalgisa, Norina, Elvira.....\$145.00
43. [Grisi Company]. Remarkable pair of carte de visite photos by Nelson & Marshall of Dublin, showing Giulia Grisi's opera troupe posed in the Green Room in 1859. In one photograph the great soprano is surrounded by company members including Pauline Viardot and Mario, and in the other image Mario, Viardot and Giuglini are prominent. The pair.....\$550.00
44. HALEVY, F. Fine 1p ALS in French by the composer of *La Juive*, nd, concerning a meeting with Auber.....\$100.00

58. LIND, Jenny. Incredible 4pp ALS signed "*J. L. Goldschmidt*", 1885, to a pupil giving her philosophy of singing. "*With my enormous experience and a life's study I ought to be able to bring out singers – for I am convinced that only when teachers can sing and show their pupils what they ought to do can real art be produced. Singing is as much moral and mental as it is mechanical. It is a combination of those qualities which alone can form the Master and her Pupil!*" This is the only letter we've seen in which the "Swedish Nightingale," arguably the most famous vocalist in history, discusses singing. 59. MARTIN, Mary. Delightful signed *Peter Pan* playbill cover.\$35.00
60. MASSENET, Jules. Complete manuscript with words and music of a choral "*Miserere*" set for tenors and basses, inscribed and signed, 1885. On the verso are further musical sketches. Fold, otherwise superb and increasingly scarce.....\$1500.00
61. MORIANI, Napoleone. Long and fascinating 2pp ALS explaining a disastrous performance of *I Puritani* at La Scala: "*During that*

Carnevale season of 1838-39 I performed six operas...I was performing Lucia in Milan...I Puritani would be second. I asked... Impresario Morelli the favor of one day of rest before going on stage in this opera which requires a fresh voice. I was convinced I wouldn't make it to the end, but the inexorable Impresario... forced me to perform by persuading me it was an order of the Government...I therefore went on stage and – as I had predicted – failed to reach the end of I Puritani...”.....\$250.00

62. NELLI, Herva. Lovely inscribed 8x10 SP as Aida.....\$50.00
63. PASTA, Giuditta. Wonderful 5x8 stipple engraving by J. Thompson as Anna Bolena, from the time of the premiere of Donizetti's opera, c.1830. Superb.....\$200.00

Fold marks, and slight edge tears, but very fine. A remarkable letter by the great coloratura soprano who created Lucia di Lammermoor. With a fine portrait engraving as Rosina.....\$350.00

67. PINZA, Ezio. Superb 7x9 SP as Boris.....\$250.00

68. PONSSELLE, Rosa. Fine 8x10 SP as La Gioconda.....\$250.00

69. PUCCINI, Giacomo. Fabulous large (8½ x11½) inscribed AMusQS from *La Fanciulla del West*. Fold mark in the middle, otherwise near mint.....\$3000.00

70. [Puccini] ILLICA, Luigi and GIACOSA, Giuseppe. Matching AQSSs from the album of Eva Tetrazzini, by the librettists of *La Bohème*. Illica has written out “Mi chiamano Mimi...”.....\$650.00

71. PUCCINI, Giacomo. Fine youthful SPc. Ideal example!..\$1650.00

72. RAISA, Rosa. Rare inscribed SPc of the great Puccini soprano as Tosca. She created Turandot in the world premiere...\$200.00

73. RONZI DE BEGNIS, Giuseppina. Fine 3rd person ALS in Italian to Sir George Smart, 1822, announcing a benefit performance. Rare of Donizetti's favorite soprano (*Maria Stuarda* was written for her). Folds, one small hole not affecting the writing...\$150.00

74. ROREM, Ned. 1p TLS, 1969. “I've never met any of the Beatles...I'm sorry my records seem unobtainable out west, since I have several new listings in the Schwann catalogue”....\$100.00

75. ROSENTHAL, Moritz. 2pp German ALS. Mounting traces.\$50.00

76. ROSSINI, G. Superb 1pp ALS to Marquis Domenico Capranica “Famous Amateur Composer of Music,” dated September, 1864. “I wish that a prompt recovery will leave you time to spend on music, certain that you do so with style and knowledge. I, although I go beyond the worn crucifix, write music to ‘kill time as they say’ and if I am still with this world when you next visit Paris... I will put forward as contribution your indulgence to hear a piece of your music.” An important association: The Capranica family owned two theaters in Rome, hiring singers like David, Ronzi and Malibran, and commissioning operas by Rossini (*Torvaldo e Dorliska*) and Donizetti (*Torquato Tasso*)...\$2450.00

77. RUBINI, Gio. Batta. Fine 2pp ALS, Italian 1842. “I promised to sing for you...I will sing the pieces listed below ...The pieces from the Stabat, The Prayer of the Brigands, and nothing else.” With a superb large litho as Arturo in *Puritani*.....\$200.00

78. RUBINSTEIN, Anton. Fine 2pp ALS, St. Petersburg, 1865, in German. “Your Ladyship I regret very much to have missed you today, but the examinations in the conservatory occupy me so that I can find very little time for anything else. Would you...join us for dinner...after...we can try several selections if you bring the music with you...Would it not interest you to be present at the vocal examinations tomorrow morning?...in the palace Michel, in the presence of H.R.H. the Grandduchess Helene...” With a fine lithograph of the great composer/pianist.....\$400.00

79. SCHORR, Friedrich. Fine SPc as Wotan, 1935.....\$50.00

80. SCHRÖDER-DEVRIENT, Wilhelmine. 1p ALS, nd, graciously but firmly refusing an invitation. The legendary soprano, whose performances inspired Wagner to become an opera composer, created his first important opera, *Rienzi*.....\$250.00

81. SCHUMANN HEINK, Ernestine. Rare youthful cabinet photo signed and dated 1899. Mounting traces on margin....\$350.00

82. [SHAW, Mary]. Mounted 4x6 pencil portrait by Alfred Chalon, signed and dated by him, "Alfred C. -- Shaw. 1836" Shaw, an English contralto (1814-1876) created the role of Cuniza in Verdi's first opera, *Oberto*. Original drawings by Chalon of the great opera singers are highly sought after and almost impossible to obtain. Only the second example that we've had.....\$2000.00
83. SIEPI, Cesare. Fine 8x10 SP as King Philip in *Don Carlo*.\$100.00
84. SMIRNOFF, Dimitri. Superb Russian SPc as Alfredo.....\$250.00

86. STRAUSS, Richard. Trimmed program for a performance of *Salome* at the Manhattan Opera House, March 26, 1909, signed by the composer at the bottom. The remarkable cast included Mary Garden and Charles Dalmores and was conducted by Cleofonte Campanini. At the time this program was signed *Salome* was considered scandalous and shocking, condemned by the likes of Billy Sunday and the religious right.....\$1500.00
87. STRAVINSKY, Igor. Fine TLS in French, Paris, June 29, 1925, on decorative Pleyel & Co. letterhead to Sam Bottenheim, the famous Dutch impresario, urging him to schedule Stravinsky's next season in Holland. " *On the subject of my Holland tour, no news whatsoever and nevertheless time presses as I must arrange all of my next season immediately...*".....\$1250.00
88. STÜCKGOLD, Grete. Lovely SPc, 1928.....\$50.00
89. TAMBERLICK, Enrico. 4pp ALS in Italian, Madrid, 1869. An interesting letter in which the tenor confesses he sold the Madrid opera house theatre equipment to D. Bey for use in the Cairo Theatre. Interesting associations. Tamberlick, the great Verdi tenor (creator of Alvaro in *Forza*) sells the equipment to the theater in Cairo which less than ten years later would present the world premiere of *Aida*! 90. TAMBURINI, A. Fine LS in French, declining an invitation due to performances. With superb lithograph portrait.....\$100.00
91. TAUBER, Richard. Superb SPc. Classic image!.....\$200.00

"After about five years during which I did not have the honor of speaking with you, nor of corresponding with you, and after five years, a period in which a rather big disagreement grew between us that I believe was over politics, ...I don't know who of the two of us was right or wrong. It is useless to speak of the past! Tomorrow I will come to see you..." Slight stains on the right portion, otherwise a fine bold example. Written the year of the premieres of *Trovatore* and *Traviata*, Verdi had relocated to Paris to prepare *Les vêpres siciliennes* for the Opéra...\$2850.00
